Item I lend to my Daughter Amey Blanks one Negro Girl Named Nell and at her

Blanks to him the said John Blanks his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joel Freeman seven hogs one Joan Old Cuck
the said Joel his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Nathaniel Freeman unto my son
Freeman deeded one Cow and half with their increase to him the said Nathaniel
his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my two Grandsons Nathan Blanks son to my Daughter
Amey Blanks and Henry Freeman son to my son Arthur Freeman Deed
my stock at my Plantation in the County of Lunenburg to be Equally
Divided between my two Grandsons to them the said Nathan Blanks and
Henry Freeman their heirs and assigns forever.

and personal to my son Josiah Freeman to him the said Josiah and to
his heirs and assigns forever.

heretofore made signed sealed and Declared
