 memory praised be God do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
 as followeth I bequeath my soul to Almighty God that gave it
 for what Estate it hath pleased him of his great mercy to bestow upon me I
 dispose of as follows (viz)

I Give and Devise to my son Henry Mitchell - my Lands and Plantation
South side of Jones hole Swamp at the Ford containing three hundred twenty
Acres or thereabouts to him and his Heirs and Assigns forever I also give to
said son my five Negroes Roger Jack Jude Math Will a boy.

n I Give and Devise to my son Thomas Mitchell my Tract of Land on the South
side of Jones hole Swamp containing two hundred and thirty seven Acres to him
his Heirs and Assigns forever I also Give and Devise to my said son my
Negroes Jack Will Larry Peter and Tab.

m I Give and Devise to my son Nathaniel Mitchell my Lands and plant-
ation whereon I now live containing four hundred Acres or thereabouts to him and
his Heirs and Assigns forever I also Give and Devise to my said son my
Plantation on the South side of Jones hole Swamp whereon he now liveth
to him and his Heirs and Assigns forever containing one hundred and fifty
Acres I also Give to my said son Nathaniel my five Negroes Mingo Betty
Rachel and Hannah

m My Will and devise is That all the rest and remaining part of my Estate
before disposed of of whatsoever kind quantity or property never be divided
four equal parts by my three sons and that my dear and loving wife
have her first choice of the said parts to her own proper use and behoof and
the other three equal parts I Give to my three sons Henry Thomas and Nat-
aniel to each a third part

My further Will and devise is that this my Estate be not Appraised I also
Constitute and appoint my son Henry to be whole and sole Executor of this my Last
and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and aff-
my seal this second day of March one thousand seven hundred and
four
