and the use of my Plantation that I now live on during her Life.

I Will, I give and Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Barham his Heirs and Assigns forever
one Negro Boy named Joe, one Negro Girl named Tab, one Negro Woman named Nan and
her Increase, and all my Lands lying on Sussex County, likewise the above decribed Negro
Boar and Nelly after her Mother's decease.

I Will, I give and bequeath unto my Son Elith Barham his Heirs and Assigns forever
one Negro Man named Bristol, one Negro girl named Tomy, and one Negro Boy
named Steeling, and all my Lands lying in Dimondie likewise the above
decribed Negro man Dick after the Decease of my Dear and loving Wife.

I Will, I give unto my loving Wife Ann and son Thomas Barham my Stock of Cattle upon
the Plantation where I now live to be equally divided between them, and after her decease
wholly and solely to my Son Thomas Barham.

I Will, I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife and my two Sons Thomas Barham and
Elith Barham all the rest and Residue of my Estate both of what kind or Quality whatsoever except
my Will and Wipcar which I leave to the use of my two Sons to be equally divided betwixen
them and because that they my two Sons make the division without any disturbance
and I constitute and Appoint my loving Wife Ann and my two Sons Thomas and Elith Barham
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and my desire is that my said Executor shall
not be compelled to give Security for their fittfull Administration and Executorship, nor no
Opparsement nor Inventory to be taken of this my last Will and Testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this eighteenth Day of December in the Year of our
Lord One Thousand seven hundred fifty six.

In primis I give and Devise to my Loving Wife Martha Banks during her Widowhood the manner Plantation, a Negro Wench Named Tilly during her life or Widowhood and when she Marries or Dies then to return to - my Son ^{Augustus} and also the third part of my Stock among Cattle Horse and Hogs and one Bed and furniture and privilege of the mill for Bread Corn.

In primis I give and Devise to my Son Burnell Banks the Water mill and Negro Boy Called Els likewise my Dark Bay Horse Saddle Bridle and a Bridle one Bed and furniture my Gun and pair of Spots and Holster and Cutlass and all the Remaining part of my Stock from which I have left my Wife and such as I shall hereafter mention for my Daughter my Desire is that my Son Burnell shall have of what is and ever to him and to his Heire Sanpully begotten of his Body forever.

In primis I give and Devise to my Daughter Susanna Banks one Negro Woman named Phillis one Bed and Furniture my Bay Mare and Collie and Bridle two Cowes and Calves four new Dicks and half dozen Stale one Iron Butt and a Box and my Desire is that if my Son or Daughter Die without Heire Sanpully begotten of their Body then thev part to let return to the Slave house.

In primis I constute and appoint my Son Burnell Banks to be Executor of this my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and sealed the same with my Seal this fifte Day of March 1758.
