In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth Bellmoy of Surrey County being very sick and weak, but of sound mind and memory, blessed be God Do make and Ordain this writing to be my last Will and Testament &c.

Item I give to my son John Bellmoy one Hundred Acres of Land to him and his heirs forever joining William Howells lines.

Item I give to my son William Bellmoy my Plantation upon the head of Shacoch Swamp to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Mildred Bell eighty Acres of Land joining the Plantation whereon the said town, to her and her heirs forever likewise joining William Brittain line and Henry Blows. And all the Remainder of my Estate I give to be equally Divided between my two Sons and Daughters, John Bellmoy, William Bellmoy and Mildred Bell. And I hereby Constitute & appoint my two sons to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto put my Hand & seal this third day of January in the Year of our Lord God one thousand seven Hundred and fifty four.
