First and Principally I give and Recommend my Soul and Spirit into the hands of God that gave it me in case and certain hope to receive the same at the General Resurrection and my Body to be buried at the Direction of my Executors hereafter Named and as for what Temporal Goods it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in the Degree of an manner and form following.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Hinchea Rochell all my Land that is lying and being above the mouth of the Branch Commonly called and known by the Name of Nats Branch it lying also in both sides of the latter Swamp containing by Estimation two Hundred and thirty nine Acres to him the said Hinchea Rochell his Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Deor Rochell all my Land that is lying being on the North side of the latter Swamp and also lying between the said Nats Branch and the Middle Branch containing by Estimation one Hundred and forty Acres to him the said Deor Rochell his Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Nathaniel Rochell my Plantation now situate on the South side one Hundred and forty Acres of Land thereunto adjoining and belonging with the Appurtenances thereto and all other things belonging thereto in any way appertaining to him the said Nathaniel Rochell his Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Rochell one Negro Boy named Dany to be his and John Rochell his Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item I give to Mary Rochell my Wife one Negro Man named Tony and one Negro girl named Judy during her Natural life. Item I bequeath to Mary Rochell my Wife all the Rest and Remainder of my Estate during her Natural life and at the Death of Mary Rochell my Wife my Will and Desire is that all the Estate that I stand to Mary Rochell my Wife should be equally divided amongst my Children.

Item My Will and Desire is that this my Estate should be Inventoried but not Appraised.

Item I do Nominate and appoint Mary Rochell my Wife my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament bearing Amending and making Void all former Wills and Testaments by me at any time here before made.
