In the name of God Amen. I John Tomlinson of the County
of Sussex and Parish of Albe marke being very sick of Body but of sound Mind
and Memory, Sheweth be to Almighty God for the same, Therefore calling to mind
the Mortality of my Body, and knowing it is appointed for all men once to Die
Do make and Order this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as
followeth, First, and principally I recommend my Immortal Soul into the hands of
Almighty God that gave it home, to win through the merits of my Blef^d Redeemer
to Inherit life everlasting, And as to my Mortal^{body} I commit to the Earth from whence
it was taken to be Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned but

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my Will is that my just Debt be paid, and verily I leave my Wardly Estate as follows, Vizt.

I give unto my son Russell Tomlinson my Plantation whereon I now dwell, and all the Land thereunto belonging, and one Negro Man, Robin, & one feather Bed & furniture, and one short Gun, half a dozen leather Chairs, one Case of Bottles, four head Cattle, two Hens, & a Dish, and six Plates & one Sheet & my riding Horse, Bridle and Saddle, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Anne Tomlinson one Negro girl Justice by name, and feather Bed and furniture, and four head of Cattle, and two Dishes & six plates & one Trunk, one Horse & one Saddle & Bridle of ten pound value to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Grandson John Tomlinson, son of Thomas Tomlinson five pound Current money of Virginia, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Grand Daughter Ann Eastbridge Daughter to Sarah Eastbridge five pounds Current money of Virginia, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give my wearing Apparel to be equally divided between my two sons John Tomlinson and Thomas Tomlinson.

Item I have two Negroes to be sold, Ned and Hannah, with all the residue & remainder of my Estate of what kind or Quality soever, and to be equally divided between my son John Tomlinson and my son Thomas Tomlinson & my son James Tomlinson and my Daughter Rebecca Heath and my Daughter Sarah Eastbridge and my Daughter Mary Benn to share and their Heirs forever. And my decree is that my Estate may not be appraised.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my two sons James Tomlinson & Russell Tomlinson Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal this twentieth day of December in the Year of our Lord Christ one Thousand seven Hundred and sixty.
