I John Innes being Sick and Weak But in perfect mind and memory Thanks be to God for the same, I do appoint this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say I Give my soul to Almighty God who gave it me and my Body to the Earth To be buried at the Discretion of my Executors and to my worldly Estate I Give devise & bequeath the same in manner and form following. *Imprimis* I Give and Bequeath to my son Lewis Innes one Negro Fellow Nam^d Ned to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my Grandson John Innes Son of Thomas Innes one Negro boy Jack to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to John Rich^d Innes Twenty Shillings.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my son Benj^t Innes two Negroes, Viz. Brown and Phillis to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my son Abner Innes my Plantation whereon I live after my Wife's decease and also two Negroes after her decease, Viz. Congo & Grace to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my Loving Wife the use of my Plantation during her Life and also two Negro Doll and Isabell to her forever and the use of Congo & Grace & Hannah as also the Cattle and Hogg at the other Plantation where she formerly lived and one Mare call'd Chance and her Calf also one Bed & Furniture and six Chairs and all the rest of the Household Furniture that she had before her death to her during her Life.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sary Floods Twenty Shillings.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Green Twenty Pounds to be paid to her in such things and as my Executors think proper.

Imprimis I Give to my Daughter Eliza^t Hunt seven shillings and six pence.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Will one Negro girl call'd Judy to her and her heirs forever.

Imprimis I Give and bequeath to my Grandson John Hunt one Negro boy call'd Sam to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis My Will & Devise is that all the residue of my Estate be Sold and if there is more than will pay my Debt and Legacies I Devise it may be divided amongst my Children equally I Execute and Appoint James Jones and my loving Wife Agnes Innes Executors of this my last Will & Testament and I give the said James Jones five per Cent on the Value of my Estate for his trouble & Expence Given under my Hand & Seal this 16 Day of Feb. 1763

I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Mumford after my just debts is paid all my Estate Real and Personal my secure is that my beloved Wife do sell all my Land as Lies in Sussex County and do give in that my Estate may not be appraised nor my Executors compelled to give Security and I do appoint my loving Wife Mary Mumford my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this 25 Day of February 1763
