Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy my best Bed and furniture my new Chair via good Silver three good Silver to her and her Heirs.

Item I give and bequeath the Remainder of my whole and sole Estate in manner as follows. My debts being first paid and satisfied, then what remains I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth and the Child she now goes with, and my Daughter Lucy above mentioned equally to be divided between the three herein mentioned to them and their Heirs.

Item Lastly I constitute and appoint my Wife Elizabeth John Wilkerson and Thomas Mitchell to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Sealed the same with my Seal this twenty fifth Day of December, one Thousand seven Hundred and Sixty.

I do hereby Impower will and Devise that my Executors above mentioned do Acknowledge make Oves in Open Court all my Wills and Titles in the Land that I sold to some Beloved Merchant in Sussex County when by him required.
