 County being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given
 to God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die, do make and publish this my last will and testament
 that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands

of God that givest and for my body I commend to the earth to be buried in a Christianlike
and decent manner at the direction of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the gene-
ral resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touch-
ing such worldly estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give down
and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Elizabeth & Mary 100 Acres of Land
more or less to be Equally divided between them, by them freely to be possessed & enjoyed
I give to my Loving Wife Ann Lill, all the residue of my estate which is not
mentioned during her life or widowhood freely to be possessed and enjoy and after marriage
or death if she Never marries I give it to my two children Elizabeth and Mary Equally to be
divided and I leave Morris Lill and Henry Poch sole Executors of this my Last will
and Testament and do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every
other testaments wills and Legacies bequests and Executors by me in any way
this time named wills and bequeathed ratifying and confirmed this and no
other to be my Last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal the day and year above written signed sealed and Pub-
licly pronounced and declared by the said Lambert Lill as his last will and Testament
in presence of us the subscribers
and I desire that my estate may not be appraised
