hundred and forty seven I Nicholas Partridge of the parish of Albemarle and
County of Surry being Sick and Weak but of Sound Mind and Memory than
be Given to God do make and Ordain this my last will in Manner and form following
that is to say first Give and Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that Give it and my body to the Earth to be decently Buried at the Direction
my Executors whom I shall appoint and as for such worldly Estate which it
shall please Almighty God to bless me with in this Life I Give and Devise the
Manner and form following that is to say.

Item Give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary Partridge the Use of the tract
Land and Plantations lying at the Mouth of a creek and up the
said Marsh to the path to a hickory Oak and so to the Ready branch and up the
Various courses of the branch to a hickory of the said branch up to the
then along the said Road to a hickory corner of William Johnson's done
Hannah Ligon Widowhood and then to my son Wells Partridge and the
heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever and the Labour of Roman and Amy
Negro to my well beloved wife Mary Partridge during her Natural Life
Widowhood and the Labour of Sam and Palt Negro and three cows and calves
and four sheeping Cattle to my son Wells Partridge to have and to hold
above said and to have in five pounds and two shillings and furniture.

 tract of Land three hundred and fifty Acres more or less to him and the heirs
 of his body lawfully begotten forever and my Tru

 children raised to be four years old if not the now wench called Amy

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Pantidge the negro Child called
 Bob a young man who is now in the hands of the Shakers.

I Give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary Pantidge all the rest of my
 Goods and Chattels and after her decease to be Equally divided among my
 Children and as to my Estate shall come to an Appraisalment and I do
 Order and Appoint my well beloved wife Mary Pantidge and Nicholas
 Pantidge Executors and Administrators of this my last will and testament and
 I do declare this to be my last will and testament and so this is the
 testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day
 and date above written.
