In the name of God Amour Peter Bagley of the County of Sussex, and
Baronet of Albemarle being indisposed in Body but of sound and disposing mind
and Memory Blesse be Almighty God therefore do make and declare this my last Will
and Testament in manner and form as follows, first and Principally I Bequeath
my Soul to Almighty God as gave it and as for what He hath placed the Lord
of his great Mercy to bestow upon me I give and Dispose of in manner and form as
followeth, To wit

- Item I give and Devise to my Son William Bagley ten Shillings Current Money of
Virginia.
- Item I give and Devise to my Son Henry Bagley ten Shillings Current Money of Virginia.
- Item I give and Devise to my Daughter Jane Lightly ten Shillings Current Money of Virginia.
- Item I give and Devise to my Daughter Sarah Readen ten Shillings Current Money of Virginia.
- Item I give and Devise to my Daughter Anne Bagley ten Shillings Current Money of Virginia.
- Item I give and Devise to my Son George Bagley my Plantation on the Black Swamp containing
two Hundred and fifty Acres to him and his Heirs forever, the said Land had of my Son
William Bagley in Exchange for that one Roanoke River, and in Case my Son William
Refuseth to make over the Land to my Son George he shall pay him Forty Pounds Current
Money of Virginia. And I give to my Son George four Battles, one feather Bed and furniture
and a Chest of Gun and a sword, and one Iron Pot, and a Croquet Club.
- Item I give and Devise to my Son James Bagley my Plantation whereon now live contain my
Three Hundred and fifty Acres to him and his Heirs forever. One feather Bed and furniture
a Gun and sword one Chest six Battles a Croquet Club, one Iron Pot, and a spit, and a Cask of
Bottles, and a sugar, and my Lady's Slide, I give to my two Sons James and George
Bagley jointly between them.
- All the rest of my Estate I give to my Daughter Mary Bagley During her Life
then to return to my two Sons George and James Bagley, who shall constitute and appoint my
Son George, and my Son James whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and
Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this
first Day of March, One Thousand and seven Hundred and fifty six.
