Rachel Marshborn of the Parish of Abington in the County of Sussex, Widow, being with ⁱⁿ Body, but of perfect Sense, Reason and Discreet Memory, do make and strain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following that is to say I bequeath my Soul to God, hoping at the General Resurrection to be reunited to the Body, and with both to enter into the Regions of Bliss & Happiness, my Body & Goods may be decently buried according to the Devotion of my Executors hereafter named and as to what Morality God doth please Almighty God to bestow upon me, these Disposes of as follows.

First after my Debt and Funeral Charges are paid, I give and bequeath unto my Son Peter Marshborn of whom I was infant at the Decease of my Husband Peter Marshborn all the Estate I have acquired since the Decease of my said Husband, to wit, my Share of a Colledge which a young Mare called Blackmore, six head of Cattle which I bought of William Dore, a Saddle, a Common Bridle, a Sash and many other things, two plain Gold Rings, a parcel of Coarse feathers, three Red Pillows, a pair of Thread stockings, all my ready Money, as also all other Estates to which I may have a Title by Law or Equity either in Right of my own or by Contingency.

Also I give unto my Sister Anne Whitfield all my wearing Apparel.

Lastly I appoint and constitute James Roy Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and do earnestly recommend him to be Guardian to my Sons John & Peter Marshborn. In Witness whereof I have set my Hand and affixed my Seal the thirteenth Day of March, in the Year of Grace, one thousand seven hundred and fifty nine.
