I Give and bequeath the best of my Estate of what kind soever it is unto beloved Wife Susan Freeman to her and her Heirs and Assigns forever. I also leave my Father John Freeman and my Wife to be whole & sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament looking and making Void all other Wills either by word or Writing heretofore made Given under my hand this fifteenth Day of March 1759.
