In the name of God Amen, this 10th Day of March one thousand seven hundred and one I Richard Hufon of the County of Sussex being but weak of Body but of sound and perfect Memory Thank be to God for the same and not knowing how soon my Duty may come, Do therefore Ordain, this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, I Bequeath my Soul to God that gave in to me hoping for mercy through the Intercession of Jesus Christ, and for my Mortal Body to be Decently Buried at the Devotion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and as for my Temporal Estate what hath been pleased God to bestow upon me, I give and Dispose of in manner following, First I will that all my just debts be Honourably paid, and my funeral expences Discharged.

- Item* I give and Devise to my Son Thomas Huson two Hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live to him and his heirs for ever.
- Item* I give and Devise to my Grand Daughter Mary Kelly one Bed and furniture, one Dish and Basin, a Bible, skillet, and salt seller.
- Item* My Devise is that there should be as much of my Personal Estate sold as will amount to forty pounds Current Money, and that Money to be equally divided between my two Daughters (namely Mary Tanner, and Elizabeth Kelly) to them and their heirs forever.
- Item* And then my Devise is that all the remaining part of my personal Estate and my Negro girl Lucy be for the maintenance and support of my Wife during her natural life, and after her decease, her part of the Personal Estate to go to my son Thomas Huson, and the Negro girl to be equally divided between my two Daughters above mentioned.
- Item* My Devise is that if in case any money is got by Sale from my Father in law's Estate due that my Wife should have the use of it during her life, and after her decease to be equally divided between my three Children above named.
- Item* My Devise and meaning is, that my Son Thomas Huson should look after and take care of his Mother and her part of the Estate for the better support of her during her life, that after her decease her part of the personal Estate should fall to him, and my Devise is that my Son Thomas Huson, and my Son in law John Kelly be Executors of this my last Will and Testament, and that my Estate be not approved. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and Year above Written.
