WILL OF ABRAHAM GREEN

Item I Give and devise to my son Peter Myke and to his heirs and assigns forever the tract of Land wherein he now lives in Louisa creek in Brunswick County containing two hundred acres more or less.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my son in Law Abraham Green upon condition that the said Abraham Green shall pay unto my son in Law Theophilus Goodwynne eight pounds current money of Virginia within twelve months after my decease my negro man mingo but if my son in Law Abraham Green shall refuse or neglect to pay the said sum of money according to the time aforementioned then I will and devise that the said negro shall be sold by the executor of this my last will and testament for the most that can be got for him and eight pounds current money of the money arising by such sale to be by my executor paid to the said Theophilus Goodwynne and the residue to the said Abraham Green.

Item I Give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Meador at her age of twenty one years or day of marriage which shall first happen a likely negro girl labourer twelve and fourteen years of age to be purchased by my executor at his expense if she shall live to attain the said age or be married.

Item I Give to my daughter Mariah my negro girl Tobb my negro boy Nitt the bed and furniture she is fully in on a spinning wheel and again of Bonds one Iron pot of a middling size, two cases and robes and also of Bonds of sixpence and eight pence.

Item I Give unto my beloved wife Sarah the labour of my negro man Sambo during his natural life and after his decease I give the said negro Sambo unto my son Peter Myke.

Item I Give to my son George Myke John Labadie and Charles brother four shillings current money of Virginia.

Item I Give unto my beloved wife Sarah during the term of her natural life the use of one equal shelf of all my stock of her cow cattle sheep and hogs and of all my household and kitchen goods and furniture and after her decease I give the same to my son Benjamin Myke.

Item I Give unto my said wife during the term of her natural life the plantation wherein I now live with two hundred acres of Land thereunto belonging, so as no part of my Land commonly called the meek be included therein.

Item I Give to my grand son Dorsey Myke son of Peter Myke my Land and Plantation on the lower pond creek in Brunswick County wherein Charles Braxton now lives being one hundred acres to hold to him the said Dorsey Myke his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I Give and devise unto my son Benjamin all that and to his heirs and assigns forever all the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or quality soever and wheresoever it is found. Lastly I do appoint my said son Benjamin Myke whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament and do desire that my estate may not be appraised and that my said son be not compelled to

In the name of God Amen August the twenty seventh one thousand seven hundred and fifty seven I Hannah Rawlings of the County of Jefferson being sick of body but of good and perfect memory thanks be to almighty God and calling to remembrance the uncertain estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must yield unto death when it shall please God to call do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following first being penitent and sorry for all my sins most humbly desiring forgiveness for the same I commend my soul to almighty God my saviour and redeemer in whom and by whose merits I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and to have full remission and forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit the Kingdom of Heaven and my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the disposal of my executors hereafter named and for the settling of my temporal estate and such goods chattels and debts as it shall please God to bestow upon me I do order give and dispose the same in manner and form following that is to say

Item I give unto my son John Rawlings my biggest Son just likewise my biggest Roster before and deep depth

Item I give unto my son Gregory Rawlings all the money as he has in his Possession be it little or much

Item I give unto my son Richard Rawlings my mare two penies before and one depth

Item I give unto my daughter Mary 2 Dozen of quater p. licks three deep and three penies ones and 1 penie depth the rough and tame and 1 single Fiddle

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth two cows and one calf

Item I give unto my grandson Denny Rawlings one large foying pen

Item I give unto my grandpa William Rawlings Senior all my cow as he is now carrying both Cows of tobacco

Item I give unto my granddaughter Sarah Rawlings all the cotton as is now growing and one Bed and furniture as first in the old House and one black one Iron Pot one box Iron and one red washing Tub and one spinning wheel and one pair of cotton bands and the worst of 24 or 30 yards and likewise cotton to fill in the said worst
