Item I Devise to my Grand Daughter Mary Butler & to her Heirs of her body fully possessed forever the Land Plantation whereon I now live with all the Appurtenances thereto belonging and the Profits of such I Give & Devise the same Land & Plantation to my Grandson Joel Tucker & to his Heirs forever also I Will & Desire that my Grandson Joel Tucker have the Use & Occupation my said Plantation & receive the profits thereof to his own Use untill my Grand Daughter shall marry or attain the Age of Twenty one year
