Teste I leave to my loving wife Mary Furrington all my estate both real and personal during her natural life or widowhood and after her decease or marriage all to my daughter *Ann* Furrington and making my loving wife Mary Furrington my whole and sole executrix a full full this my last will and testament and my desire is that my estate be inventoried and not appraised as witness my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of November one thousand seven hundred fifty and seven.
