In the name of God Amen. I Stoman Wynne of Sussex County being sick and weak but of sound disposing mind and Memory Do constitute Ordain and Appoint this to be my true last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all Former Wills by me heretofore made.

I hereby give to my loving son Matthew one Negro girl named Bait to him and his Heirs forever.

I give to my loving son Stoman Twenty Shillings.

I give to my loving Daughter Suerelia Wynne the Child that my Negro Woman Tabb now goes with, to her & her Heirs for ever.

I give to my loving Daughter Anne Sturdivant twenty shillings.

I give to my loving son Robert and to his Heirs forever one Negro Boy named Peter as also a Tract of Land being part of that on which I now live and the Land conveyed to me by Holam Sturdivant which is divided from the other part of Land by a line Beginning at the Islands and running to William Dances line, the said Land lying on the south side of the said line & containing by estimation one Hundred and seventy four Acres.

I give to my loving son William Wynne, and to his Heirs for ever, one Negro Boy named Ben.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Wynne, one Bed and Furniture one small Iron Pot, one pewter Dish, one Bason and four Plates, I also lend to my said Daughter (after the decease of my beloved Wife) for and during the Term of her life one Negro girl named Hannah, and after the decease of my said Wife and Daughter, I give and devise the said Negro with her due care to my Grandson Robert Wynne son of my said Daughter Elizabeth, to him and his Heirs forever.

I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Daughter of my son Matthew, one young Cow or Kieffer.

I lend to my beloved Wife during her Natural life or Widowhood the Use and Labour of the following Slaves, to wit, Digge, Tab & Hannah, I also lend to my said Wife during her Natural life or Widowhood as aforesaid all my said Goods and Chattels not already Devided, and after her Death or Marriage I give and Devise to my loving son Steth and to his Heirs forever, all my said Goods and Chattels lent to my said Wife with the two Negro Slaves not before divided of named Digge and Tab.

I do hereby constitute Ordain and Appoint my beloved Wife Elizabeth, my loving son Robert, and Nicholas Mafenburg my true and lawful Executors of this my last Will, and direct that my Estate may not be Appraised. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal this 30th Day of June 1760.

Signed, sealed & Delivered by the Testator to be his last Will in Presence of Us, who at his Request and in his presence subscribed Our Names as Witnesses thereto.
