Forever but if the said Josiah should Die without heirs of his Body Lawful
begotten my will is that the said Plantation with all the Appurtenances there
unto belonging should descend to my son Henry Freeman his heirs and
Assigns forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son Josiah Freeman one Negro man Named O
