Item I Give and Bequeath my Riding Horse to my Cousin William Delightly.

Item I Give and Bequeath to My Loving Father all the Rest of my Estate be it in what Quality soever.

Item My Will and Desire is that my Estate be not Appraised.

Lastly I do Nominate and Appoint my Loving Brother William Shands and My Thomas Young Executors of this my Last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal this Thirteenth Day of Nov^r in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty four.
