Saviour, and my Body I commit to the Earth to be Buried at the Devotion of my Executors
hereafter Named, and my worldly Estate I give and devise as follows.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Daughter Mary Bragg and to her Heirs forever
One certain Tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the Parish and County
afore said, Containing Three Hundred and forty Acres, and is Bounded as follows Patent
bearing Date the fifth Day of June one thousand seven Hundred and forty one, the
therunto being had will more fully and at large appear.

Item My Will and desire is that if my said Daughter Mary should Die without issue
that then the said Tract or parcel of Land and Premises and every part
thereof unto my loving Daughter Jane Northcote and to her Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item My will and desire is that my personal Estate, be equally Divided between my loving
Daughters Jane Northcote, and Mary Bragg except such as hereafter mentioned.

Item I give unto my loving Daughter Mary Bragg my Gold Ring.

Item My Will and Desire, that my Estate be not Appraised.

And lastly I do Nominate and appoint my loving Friends Edward Lyles, John Mafon of David
Mafon Executors of this my last Will and Testament, revoking all former Wills and
Requests by me before made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal the twentieth Day of April in the Year of Our Lord Christ one thousand seven
Hundred and sixty.
