This Account Current of the estate of Robert Wynne deceased was returned into Court by Joseph Tucker the executor and being examined by persons specially appointed for that purpose, was by the Court ordered to be recorded

In the name of God Amen the 17th day of October in the year of our Lord 1757 as the said John Dwell aged and fifty seven William Dwell of Albemarle parish and County of Sussex being at this time of sound and perfect memory thanks be given unto God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say first of all I give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it me and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and usual manner at the discretion

of my executors and as touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life. I give and devise unto my nearest and truest loving friends

my debts being first well and truly paid. I give and devise unto my deight son William Harper and to his heirs forever all my Lands which I hold in Dinwiddie County negro man named Matt negro boy named Dick and the labour of the said Negro Matt from the time he has had him in Possession, and all my part of the flock excepting any young more

Item I give and devise unto my son Nathl Harper and to his heirs forever all my Lands which I hold on fourth western frontier granted to me by patent bearing date the 28 day of August 1756 and one negro boy named Bob and negro Wench named Nan negro boy named Aaron and ten Pounds current money of Virginia and all my wearing Cloaths like wife adjoining more which my son William Harper has now in Possession and all Accounts that is due from him to me likewise half a dozen sheep and ten young Hogs.

Item I give and devise unto my son Edward Harper and to his heirs forever four hundred twenty and seven Acres of Land which I hold on the south side of Appomattock be the same more or less it being the Lands which I bought of James Lyricson and some part of another tract adjoining the said tract negro man named Tom negro man named Ned negro wench named Fanny and two Iron pots

Item I give and devise unto my son Benjamin Harper and to his heirs forever four hundred and twenty Acres of Land lying and being on the North side of Appomattock be the same more or less it being all I hold on that side of the said Creek one negro man named Tony negro wench named Peggy negro girl named Lucy negro boy named Peter and negro boy named Billy my self and Coppy Nettles two Iron Pots a large pot and a small one and his negroes to continue on the plantation till he comes to the age of twenty years then to take them in Possession and likewise his part of the flock to continue on the plantation

Item I give and devise unto my daughter Milly Seaker and to her heirs forever one negro girl named Hannah

Item I give and devise unto my daughter Frances Harper and to her heirs forever one negro boy named Myles and ten Pounds current Money of Virginia

Item I give and devise unto my daughter Martha Rivers and to her heirs forever negro boy named Cabel

Item I give and devise unto my son Edward Harper above mentioned two feather beds and three covering half my flock of cattle hogs and sheep

Item I give and devise unto my son Benjamin Harper above mentioned and to his heirs forever two feather beds and covering half a dozen Leather Cloves shof of ironware and square Table and the Chest that stands in store and half my flock of cattle hogs and sheep also any young more that belongs to the plantation also my riding saddle harness and bridles and his part of household goods to remain in the shop

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and himself to be pleased and it to be paid out of his own part of the estate and to be under the care of my sons Myatt and Edward Harper

Item Myatt and Edward unto my sons Edward and Benjamin Harper above mentioned my work ^{implements} and harrows for the use of his plantation and my land and fold for the supportment of their stock and Negroes

Item Myatt and Edward unto my three sons Myatt Edward and Benjamin Harper my crop of Boudry to be paid and money arising thereby to be equally divided and all the remaining part of my moveable estate not above mentioned to be equally divided Between them at the discretion of any two persons whom they shall chuse and approve and that when so divided into parts each the said Myatt Edward and Benjamin Harper shall draw Lots for choice

Item my will and desire is such that no part of my estate be appraised and that my executors shall in any wise be obliged or compelled to give security for performance of the same and further the likewise my executors shall make and obtain my two sons Myatt and Edward Harper above mentioned to be my whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament and have the care of my Benjamin Harper and his estate till he comes to the age of twenty years as above mentioned and I do hereby utterly disannul revoke and dissolve all and every other testaments wills and bequest legacies and executors by me before mentioned writt or bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and date above written
