Sense and Memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament and  
first of all bequeath my Soul unto God, hoping at the general Resurrection to have  
that He united to my Body and with both to enter into eternal Happiness purchased  
by my dear Redeemer Jesus Christ, through whose Merits alone I hope for Salvation.  
my Body I desire may be buried in a Christian like manner, according to the direction  
of my Executors hereafter mentioned. and as touching what the Lordy Godd in His  
pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me, I thus Dispose of, in manner and to the
