In the Name of God Amen the Twenty eight Day of March one thousand seven hundred and
sixty three I William Hie of Sussex County being in perfect Sense and Memory and Calling
to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to dye
Do make this my Last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all
I recommend my soul to God that gave it and for my Body I am content to be
buried in a Christianlike and Decent manner And as touching such worldly Estate
as it hath Pleased God to Bless me in this life I give and Dispose in manner hereunder
following Vizt

I Impromise I give and bequeath unto my Son Sublet Hie five pounds of his
furniture that he has at home one cow and calf one good Old one Quarter Bush and one
small before three Plates

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Naomi Hie five Pounds and the Use of furniture
I now lie on one cow and calf one Bush one small one before three Plates

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane Maria Hie five pounds

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Hie five shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Sarah Hie five pounds

Item I give to my son Sublet Hie all that part of my Land lying on the North side
of Evanses path to him and his heirs

Item I give to my Daughter Morris Hie all the remaining part of my Land lying on the
South side of Evanses path to her and her heirs, to be divided by a line of trees by the
possessor

Item I leave to my wife Mary Hie all the remaining of my Estate of what kind so ever
During her Life and Widowhood and to live on my Plantation and Land during
her life and Widowhood but after her Life or Widowhood then all the Remainder
of my Estate tend to my wife Mary Hie to be sold for money & to be Equally divided
Among my other three Children which hath had no part of my Estate my
Daughter and your accepted for it is my Desire that my son Sublet Hie may have
the same likewise Constable make and deliver in my well beloved friends

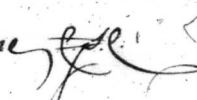
