Item I give unto my son John Sanders all that Land of Plantation whereon I now live to
him and his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my beloved wife Mary Sanders one Negro Man named Procher who all
my personal Estate stock and household goods all which I gave to my said wife during
her life & to her disposal at her Death.

Item My will is that my said wife have the use of the Plantation on which I now live
during her natural life or widowhood.

Item my will & Desire is that my said Estate be not appraised

Lastly I constitute & appoint my son John Sanders sole Executor of this my last will &
Testament
