In the name of God amen William Shands of Supra County being in Health of Body and of perfect mind and Deepening Memory Shands be to Almighty God for the same, but not knowing how soon my Change may come To make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

I Give and Bequeath to my son William Shands and his Heirs forever, all that part of the Tract of Land now live on that live on the Southside of the Road a sit now govt. sales live and Deive to my said son William and his Heirs forever, all that part of my Land called West of that lies on the Outer most end of the said Tract, bounded by a line to be run Beginning at the Uppermost spring on West Branch, and in a straight course to the corner that divides Col. Harrison's and Mr. Garding's Land.

I Give and Deive to my Grandson John Shands and to the Male Heirs Lawfully begotten of his Body my Plantation whereon I now live with all the Land thereon adjoining that is on the Northside of the Road Salvoque to my said Grandson John Shands and to the Male Heirs Lawfully begotten of his Body, all the remainder part of my Tract of Land called West (not mentioned to my son William) But in case said Grandson should die not leaving such Heirs as above mentioned I then give

Witness of, said Land to my Son William Shands and his three persons.

Item My Will and Desire is that my Daughter and Son Elizabeth Shands may have the Liberty of Working the Land left to my Grandson John Shands During her Widowhood.

Item My Will and Desire is that my Loving Wife Margaret Shands may have the use of my Land and Plantation During her Natural Life. Likewise have the use of all my Slaves, Furniture and Household Goods & Stocks to my said Wife during her Natural Life. And I give my Negro Wench called Judith to my said Wife, to be at her own disposal.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Grandson John Mitchell my Negro Boy called Will which he & Nathaniel Mitchell both now in Possession.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Grandson James Shands my Negro Girl called George.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son William Shands my two Negro Boys called Dick and Nathan.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Grandson Shands Gallegally three Cattle (Two and four hinds) one Cow and half and one Horse, after the Decease of my said Wife.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son William Shands after the Decease of my said Wife all my Stocks, Household Goods, and Eyedebits.

Item My Will and Desire is that my Estate be not Appraised.

Lastly I Appoint my Son William Shands my inheritor and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Disannulling all former Wills by me before made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal the fourth Day of January in the year of our Lord 1708 and second year of our said King's said Majesty.
