In the name of God Amen. I William Tomlinson of the County of Suffolk and Parish of Aldeburgh being weak of Body but of sound mind and Memory Thanks be to Almighty God for the same therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all Men once to Die Do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth first and principally I recommend my Immortal Soul into the Hands of Almighty God that gave it to me hoping through the Merits of my Blessed Redeemer to inherit Life Everlasting and as to my Mortal Body I commit it to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned First my Will is that my just Debts and Funeral Expences be paid: Secondly I leave my Mortal Estate as followeth Vizt.

I Give unto my Loving Father John Tomlinson one Feather Bed and Furniture to him and his Heirs forever.

I Give unto my Brother Russell Tomlinson one Negro Boy Named Harry and all my Wearing Apparel to him and his Heirs forever.

I Give my Land and my Negro fellow to be sold and all the Residue and Remainder of my Estate of what kind or Quality soever and the Money to be Divided in Eight parts one Eighth to my Honoured Father John Tomlinson, one Eighth to my Brother John Tomlinson, and one Eighth to my Brother Thomas Tomlinson and one Eighth to my Brother James Tomlinson and one Eighth to be Divided Between my Sister Rebecca Heeth's Son John Heeth and her Daughters Amy Heeth and one Eighth to my Sister Sarah Carbridge's Daughters Anne Carbridge, and one Eighth part to my Sister Mary Renn's Son and Daughters Friedrich Renn and Elizabeth Renn Equally Divided, and one Eighth part to my Sister Anne Tomlinson Lastly I constitute and Appoint my two Brothers Thomas Tomlinson and James Tomlinson Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty third Day of November in the Year of Our Lord Christ one Thousand seven Hundred and sixty.
