Woman to die, and I desire this to be my Last Will and Testament in manner and form,
That I do hereby give, sell, and bequeath unto the Hands of Almighty God, who gave it me, hoping for in
through the merits of Jesus Christ my Beloved Saviour and Redeemer, my
wife, and my children, and decent like manner at the discretion of my Executors
and Administrators, for my worldly Goods, what it hath pleased God to bestow upon me,
in manner and form following.

First, I do hereby give, sell, and bequeath unto Thomas, Thoson, Joseph, Bennington, and William, the
the Sons of the said Nathaniel Clanton, to them their Heirs and Assigns forever.
And I do hereby give, sell, and bequeath unto my Wife Ann Clanton all my Estate, both Personal, and Real, the best
and the most, to be used by my Children till they come of age, or Marries, and my desire is that
my said Children, when they come of age or Marries, that my Estate be Equally divided betw
my Wife and my Children, or the Executors of them, by the Discretion of any three, or more
whom they shall choose, and their parts remaining to them and their Heirs forever.

I Give and Bequeath to my son William Shands and his Heirs forever, all that part of the Tract of Land now live on that live on the Southside of the Road a sit now govt. Sales live and Bequeath to my said son William and his Heirs forever, all that part of my Land called West of that lies on the Outer most end of the said Tract, bounded by a line to be run Beginning at the Uppermost Spring on Mice's Branch, and in a straight course to the corner that divides Col. Harrison's and Mr. Harding's Land.

I Give and Bequeath to my Grandson John Shands and to the Male Heirs of my Grandson of his Body my Plantation whereon I now live with all the Land thereon adjoining that is on the Northside of the Road Salvoque to my said Grandson John Shands and to the Male Heirs of his Body, all the remainder part of my Tract of Land called West of that not mentioned to my son William. But in case said Grandson should die not leaving such Heirs as above mentioned I then give
