- In the name of God Amen, December the 17th 1764. I Absalom Tjue of Sussex County, being at this present of sound and disposing memory do make this my last will and Testament, and I test, I give my soul to God that gave it me, and to Jesus Christ hoping for to be received into Heaven, and as for my worldly goods, which God has blessed me with my just debts being just paid, I give devise and dispose of as in form and manner following.
- Item, I give and devise unto my beloved wife Silvia Tjue, two feather beds and furniture.
- Item, My will and pleasure further is that the my said wife shall have the use of my whole Estate during her widowhood, except one Mare called Polly, which said Mare I give and devise unto Thomas Tjue, son of my brother Thomas Tjue deceased.
- Item, my will and pleasure further is that if my said wife be delivered of the Child she now is with Child with, that if my said wife maies a son, then at the day of her Marriage, the said Child be it Male or female, shall then have two thirds of my whole Estate above named or mentioned, and if it pleases Almighty God that the my said wife should not live to bring forth a living Child which she now goes with, or the said Child being born alive should die in Infancy or without heir of its body then my will and pleasure is that my said wife shall have the use of all my whole Estate during her natural life.
- Item, My will and pleasure further is that if the said Child, as is yet in my wife's womb should die according to the tenor of the above writing, that then immediately after the death of my wife, my land shall remain unto John and Thomas the sons of my brother Thomas Tjue deceased and to their heirs forever, and my two negroes named Congo and Grace remains likewise at the death of my wife, unto Dorothy and Sil^{ly} daughters of my brother Richard Tjue, and if in like manner the Child above mentioned should die in form as is above specified, then my will and pleasure is that at the death of my said wife, my negro girl named Hannah shall then remain unto Williamson Tjue son of my brother Benjamin Tjue.
- Item, lastly I appoint my Friend John Freeman and my beloved wife to be executors of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 17th day of December 1764, as is above written.
