- To Samuel Hunt I give a horse &c. Belonging to my Bay Mare
- To William Hunt I give all my Land and what I have Sold. to Henry Hef to his heirs forever
- To my Daughter Susannah Hunt I give a Bed & Furniture.
- To my Loving wife I leave my Negro's Kate & Herbert a Bed and Furniture during her Natural
Life, all so I leave her the one fourth part of the Remainder of my Estate after my debts are paid During
her undivided my Will and desire is that all the Rest of my Estate of what nature or Quality so ever be
Sold and Equally divided amongst my three Children Namely Samuel Hunt, William Hunt &
Susannah Hunt, Lastly I do Constitute and appoint my Loving Wife Hannah Hunt and
my Brother John Hunt Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, Signed and Sealed in
in the presence of

Court & refused to prove or any other wise to be concerned with or act under the said will whereupon in
the motion of John Walker who made Oath as the law directs the said will is ordered to be Recorded
& homologated is granted them for obtaining Letters of Adminⁿ with this will annex upon giving security
whereupon he with full Power his security entered into & acknowledged their bond for his due Adminⁿ of this
