I Also Give and devise to my said Son John One Negro Boy named Jack and one feather bed & furniture to him and his Heirs -
It is my Will and devise that my Daughter Loughtin Fanning may have the care and tuition of my son John until he shall arrive to the age of twenty one Years, and it is my intent and meaning that the Bed given to my son may be delivered to him at the age of twenty one Years -

I Give to my beloved Wife Rachel One Negro Woman named Phoebe of all and every other part of my estate that I now have in possession or Reversion to her & her Heirs forever -
I As hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Rachel & Richard Huff my true and law-ful Executors & Beheirs of this my last Will and Testament and I desire that my estate may not be appraised, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 28th of January 1767.
