In the name of God, Amen, the Twelfth day of February in the Year of 1760.

I Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and sixty nine. I Thomas Capell being in health of body and of good and perfect memory, thanks be to Almighty God, and calling to remembrance the uncertain Estate of this Transitory life and that all flesh must yield unto death when it shall please God to call, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following. First being penitent & sorry for all my sins, most humbly desiring forgiveness for the same. I commend my soul to Almighty God, my Saviour & Redeemer, in whom one by whose merits I trust and believe myself to be saved, and to have full remission and forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit the Kingdom of heaven and my body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the direction of my Executors hereafter named, and for the settling of my Temporal Estate and such Goods, Chattels & debts as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, I do Order Give & assign of in the same manner & form following (that is to say). Imprimis -

I Give and bequeath unto my son Edward Capell seven shillings and sixpence in money to him and his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my son John Capell seven shillings & sixpence in money to him and his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Charles Capell seven shillings & sixpence in money to him & his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Battle seven shillings and sixpence in money to her and her Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Battle seven shillings & sixpence in money to her and her Heirs forever.

I Give My Devise is that my Lands may be sold after the death of my wife Ann Capell and the money it sells for to be equally divided between my three sons Thomas Capell Ransom Capell and Sterling Capell, therefore I do give and bequeath the said money equally to be divided between Thomas Ransom & Sterling Capell to them and their Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Capell one feather bed and furniture the bed he now lies on to him & his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Ransom Capell one feather bed and furniture the bed he now lies on to him and his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Sterling Capell one feather bed and furniture
