In the name of God Amen Edward Buchan being now dead  
of Health but of sound memory do give and declare as follows  
I give to James Buchan fifty Acres of Land adjoining of James Buchan in his own  
name whom his Name for me —  
Also I give to my son James Buchan the remainder of the tract of Land I now have at the south  
or maney of his mother to him & his Heirs forever —  
I give to my beloved wife all the tract of Land I now have on me — already given during her  
life or understanding also all my estate both real and personal during her life or understanding also  
it is my will that the said estate at her death or marriage be equally divided between them  
James Buchan & Anna, & I appoint my Beloved wife Anna to take my children  
Buchan and that there be no apprenticeship nor Inwritting nor no summing. But all things to be  
as per my last will & Testament — this 17<sup>th</sup> day of February 1767.
