I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Whitefield four negroes named Jenny, Nan, Peter, and Kate, to her and her heirs forever. I likewise give unto my daughter Mary Whitefield one feather bed and furniture, & one warming pan, two English chairs & one large chest, to her and her heirs forever. —
