In the name of God Amen. Hinchea Gilliam of Superior County being sick of body, but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God. And calling to remembrance the uncertainty of human life. Do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, First I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it me and my body to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned. And as to the rest, I give what Temporal Estate is has pleased Almighty God to bestow on me for above my debts, I dispose of as follow.

Item - I Give and bequeath to my son Hinchea Gilliam a part or parcel of Land joining William Bruggs Land, Offhand of Thompsons dead cut off from my other Lands by a line beginning at Thompsons line upon my Spring run, thence up the said run to a corner Gum on the South side of the Spring, thence about South - West to a Walnut in the old Orchard, thence a straight line to an Oak by Cooks pond, thence down a line of marsh to a line between my Home plantation and the Survey I made to Benjamin Roberts line on the side of the little Town Swamp, This cut off or South parcel of my Land cut off from the rest by the aforesaid line. I Give unto my son Hinchea Gilliam and his Heirs forever.

Item - I Give and bequeath to my Son William Gilliam a part or parcel of my remaining Land lying upon Black Water, beginning at the mouth of John Edmunds Mill Swamp, thence up the said Edmunds line to William Bruggs line, thence up the said Bruggs line to the fork of my Mill pond, thence up the right hand fork of the pond, the water down to a spring known by the name of the hot spring and from the spring a line of marsh to a Hickory in William Roberts line thence down the said Roberts line to Black Water swamp, thence down the said Swamp to John Edmunds line, where it begins. This part or parcel of Land I Give unto my son William

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William and his heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son John Gilliam the remainder part of my Land with all the improvements thereon to him and his heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann my large Chest of drawers, One feather bed, Furniture and the bed Pillows and Saddle and fiddlers of at my Death Whichever he is for ever.

Item And if either of my Sons should learn the Carpenters Trade my Will and desire is that they may have my Carpenters Tools

Item I Also give and bequeath to my wife Ann all the remainder part of my Estate during her Natural life or Widowhood or until my eldest Son Arrives at the Age of Twenty one for the bringing up my Children and my will and desire is that at my wifes Death or Marriage or when my eldest Son Arrives at the age of Twenty one. That the whole estate shall be equally divided between my wife and Children by two discreet persons. Also my Will and desire is that if my estate should ever be divided as above and my wife have a separate part thereof, that at her death it may return to my Children & be equally divided between them. And also my will & desire is that if either of my sons die under Age unmarried that what I have herein given him may be equally divided between the survivors. Lastly I appoint my Brother John Gilliam Thomas Chappell & my wife Ann Executors & Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness I have hereunto set my hand & Affixed my seal this Twelfth day of December, One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight.
