and Order that my last will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and
Recommend my Soul in the hands of God that gave it, and for my body, I recommend it to the
Earth to be buried in a Christianlike manner and form at the discretion of Executors, nothing
doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God, and as touching such worldly estates where with it hath pleased God to bless me
with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Impromises. It is my will I do Order in the first place that all my just debts and funeral charges
be paid and satisfied.

I give all the remainder of my Estate both Real and personal and mine to my well
beloved wife Sarah Andrew during her widowhood, or life, and after her marriage
or death, to be equally divided amongst all my Children that is alive at her decease
whom I likewise constitute make and Ordain my only and Sole executor of this
my last will and Testament. And I do hereby utterly disallow, Revoke and Disannul
all and every other former Testaments wills Legacies and Executors by me in any
ways before this time, named, willed and Beguethed, Ratifying confirming this and
no other to my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal the day and Year above writte.
