Item my Will and devise farther is that no part of my Estate be Appraised neither shall my Executor hereafter mentioned be compelled to give

Bond or Security for the performance thereof

Item I lastly appoint my Daughter Angillies Cain above named to be my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 18th Day of September 1765
