In the Name of God AMEN I James Jones being sick and weak but in perfect
mind and memory thanks be to god for the same I constitute and appoint this my last Will and Testament in
manner and form following I give my soul to Almighty god who gave it me and my body to the Earth
to be buried at the discretion of my executors and as to my worldly Estate I give devise and bequeath the same in
manner and form following Item I give and bequeath to my living wife the use of my Plantation I now
live on during her widow hood - also the use of the following Negroes during her widow hood Mr. Dick
Troy, Nan, Annaka, Soney, Milley, Sarah, Ben, Charles and Peter, I also give her the use
of Ned Lucy Bob Haner and Mary, during her life on condition that she Educates and Maintains all
my children I also give her during her life two Black Horses and one Saddle mare my double bridle
& Harness Twenty head of cattle viz Five Cows Six three years old Six two years old and five one
years old Ten ewes and Twenty Head of Hogs Also one Hlft of Twenty Gallons and all my household
and Kitchen Furniture to my Hart and Wheats and all my Corn and meat Item the residue of
my Estate except the Negroes that I have not mentioned I desire may be sold and the money arising
from such sale be put to Interest untill my son Frederick Jones comes to the age of twenty one
years and the Negroes that I have not willed away hired out till that time and then be Equally divided
among my three sons And if either of my sons should die I desire my Estate may be divided between my living
sons I desire is that I purchased of William Kirtt in Dinwiddie County may be sold and the money
arising from such sale be put to Interest till my son comes of age as aforesaid I also desire the Estate I have
given my wife the use of what ~~of her~~ kind son or at her death be Equally divided amongst my sons that shall
be then living I constitute and appoint my brothers Robert Jones and Hamilton Jones Executors
of this my last will and Testament and I give my brother Robert Jones Ten Pounds and my
Saddle and Houson for his trouble Given under my hand and Seal this Eleventh
day of March One thousand seven hundred and seventy two
