John Jackson of the Parish of All Saints
& County of Suffolk being aged weak & infirm of Body but of perfect sense Memory & disposing Judgment do make certain
this my last Will & Testament I bequeath my soul unto God hoping at the General Resurrection to have that reunited to my Body
& with both to enter into eternal Happiness by my Dear Redeemer Jesus Christ thy Body I desire may be buried according
to the ancient Rites of our Holy Church the Church of England of which I have ever professed myself a member And
as touching what worldly Goods as it has pleased Almighty God to bestow on me (after my just Debt & Funeral Charges
are paid) I dispose of in manner & to the Persons following

- First I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary (Elder one Negro Woman) Slave named Nan to bind her Years
- Also I give and bequeath unto my son James Jackson one Negro Fellow named Fountain now in his Possession
binding his Years
- Also I give and bequeath unto my Son Charles one Negro Boy named Fountain likewise my Negro Teller
Sharon to bind his Years
- Also I give & bequeath unto my Daughter in Law Amey Jackson Widow of Thomas Jackson and the Use & Profit of my
Negro Man Sam during her natural Life & my Will further is that after the Death of the said Amey Jackson the

October Court MDCCLXX

Shall be sold & the Money arising from the Sale thereof to be equally divided among the Children of my son Thomas &c: as many as shall be then Living.

Also I give & bequeath unto Mary Waller who now lives with me Ten Pounds current Money my best Bed & Furniture & Bedstead a spinning Wheel & Cards my Grey Mare a Copper Coffee Pot & further I give to the said Mary Waller during her natural Life a Negro Fellow named Abram & my Will is that after her Death the said Negro Nan Abram shall descend to my Grandson John Jackson son of Charles to him & his Heirs I likewise give & bequeath to the said Mary Waller a Trunk a side saddle & all her wearing Apparel.

Also I give & bequeath unto each of my sons Robert & John Jackson one Shilling Current Money to be paid them by the Executor of this my last Will & Testament.

Also The Residue of my Estate (after the Legacies heretofore & hereafter mentioned are paid & satisfied) of what Kind & Sort whether real or personal I desire may be sold by my Executor hereafter mentioned to the highest Bidder & the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between the Persons following Viz Edward Jackson Benjamin Tucker Charles Jackson William Jackson Mary Childs & James Jackson & if any of these my six young Daughters should die before me my Will is that the eldest Child of each shall be entitled to the share here mentioned. I do hereby nominate and James Doan my true whole & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament & I do hereby allow give & bequeath unto the said James Doan one Hundred Pounds current Money for his Trouble in Executing & for performing this my last Will & Testament as Witness my hand and seal this twenty seventh Day of August One thousand seven hundred and Seventy.

At a Court held for Sussex County the 18th Day October 1770
