Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Lashley twenty five shillings.

Item I give unto my grandchild John Lashley my gold watch to be sold and after all my just debts is paid.

Item I give unto my Daughter William Lashley my house with the barn and shop.

Item I give unto my said son William Lashley two feather beds one furniture and all my other
 household stuff.

Item I do hereby appoint my said son William Lashley and William Roberts to be my true and
 sole Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set
 hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of January 1767.

I William Roberts of the County of Sussex being in Perfect Health and Sound Memory but desiring to mind the Uncertainty of Life and being Willing to settle my worldly affairs do make manifest Testate and Affirm this my last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof Following first I Recommend my Soul to the Almighty God and my Body to the Earth from Whence it came and as for the worldly Goods whereunto It hath Pleased God to Endow me With in Manner and form following that is to say first &c.

Item I Give and Devise to my Son William Roberts one certain tract or Parcel of Land containing by Estimation four hundred and Sixty five Acres to the same more or less lying in the parish of Edmund's Mill Church. I like wise Give to my said Son William two Negroes Named Sue and Fortune like wise all my House hold Furniture as he hath now in his own Possession and after my wife's Death or Marriage I Give to my said Son one Negro Man Named Robin all which I Give to him his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Devise to my son Willm^t Roberts after my Wife's decease or Marriage all that Part of the Tract of Land with Plantation whereon I now live in which the Dwelling House now is to be Divided from the Middle of the Day Slaph beginning at the Stone between Ancheria Gilliam and my self Inside of the Slaph thence turning by the said Slaph to Patrick's Slaph then I Give to my said Son Willm^t two Negroes Named Moses Sam^l & such my Feather Bed and furniture one small Gun named by the Name of the Cherokee; two Large Dishes and one half a Dozen Plates my Carpenter's tools with my whip-cane & Croquet stick all my wearing Cloaths, and after my Wife's death or Marriage I Give to my said Son Willm^t one Negro man named Tom all which I Give to him his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Devise to my Son Benjamin Roberts all the Remainder Part of the Tract of Land whereon I now live being the Upper Part thereof the same containing by Estimation three hundred & forty three Acres to the same more or less the Other Part being before devised to my said Son Willm^t Roberts I like wise Give to my Son Benjamin two Negroes Named Jack and Wife one Riding Horse named by the Name of Frimikin one Feather Bed & furniture In
large.
