First I Give and bequeath unto my son Marcus Pennington all my lands on the South side of the Hunting Quarter Swamp and one Great Mill, and Twenty five acres on the North side joining to the said mill Two Hundred & Thirty acres more or less I do Give to my son Marcus Two Young Negroes named Ned and Oney to him & his heirs for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca Pennington Two Young Negroes named Harry & Esther to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Aggy Johnson Fifty pounds Cash to be paid by my Executors Hereafter named.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Pennington Eighty pounds Cash to be paid by my Executors

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Pennington my land & Plantation whereon I now dwell the also one Great mill & the Labour of all my Negroes named Dick Hannah Patsy Ned Oney Harry Esther, and old Harry also all my Cattle Horses & Hogs & sheep. Also all my household Furniture during her life. After her (Because my Desire is that Dick Hannah Patsy & old Harry should be sold in Order to have money to pay the legacies given) I do leave all my Land lying on the North side of the Hunting Quarter Swamp to be sold by my Executors two Hundred & Eighty nine Acres more or less in Order to have money to pay off the Legacies given.

Item I Give & bequeath to my son Joshua Pennington Twenty five pounds Cash to be paid by my Executors

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Marcus Pennington one New Copper Cask of Horn to him & his heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath all my personal Estate after my loving Wife Mary Pennington's decease to be equally Divided between my son Marcus, Rebecca & Sarah after my debts and funeral Expenses be Discharged.

My Will & Desire is if Lucy Pennington Widow to my son Moses continues a Widow after my Wife decease she may have the use of half the Land & Plantation whereon I now live during her Widowhood and the use of the following Slaves Ben & George during her natural Life Also at my Wife decease I give to the said Lucy the head of Cattle two Sows & Pigs one feather Bed & furniture
