Year of our Lord Christ One Thousand seven hundred & sixty five, I John Sam^o more
of Superior County, being of sound & disposing mind & memory thank be to God
for the same & calling to mind the certainty of Death & the uncertainty of this
Transitory life Do Make Constitute & Ordain this my last will & testament in
manner following (that is to say) I Give & Recommend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God who gave it me hoping for Salvation through the merits of my
Beloved Redeemer Jesus Christ, and my body I commend to the earth to be decently
buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned; and as for my debts
& what wherewith it hath pleased God, to bless me with after my just debts are
paid, I give & Dispose of as Follows.

I Give unto my loving wife Susanna Sammons during her natural life
all that part of my land & the plantation whereon I now live that lies above the
great branch next above my mother's, supposed to be about thirty Acres. I also Give
unto my said wife all my Stocks of Horses, Cattle & Hogs & Household Furniture dur-
ing her natural life. After that my just debts are paid. And my further will
is that after my wife's death the said Tract or parcel of Land so lent unto
her shall be sold together with the personal estate (if any) by my Executors at
the surviving one of them or their Heirs, for the best price that can be had for
the same & the money arising from such sale to be equally divided amongst
my loving Children which shall be then living.

Item I do hereby authorize & empower Direct that my Executors or Executors do sell all that part of my Tracted parcel of Land whereon my Mother now lives that lies below the Great branch next above my Mother, supposed to be about forty five Acres with the Appurtenances thereto belonging for the best price that can be got for it & the Money arising from the sale thereof to be first applied to the Discharge of my just debts & that my executors do make true & convey the said Land by a sufficient deed or deeds for that purpose to any person who shall purchase the same

And Lastly I do hereby Nominate and appoint my loving Friends David Mason & Robert Seal my whole sole Executors of this my last will & testament hereby revoking & Disannulling all former wills & bequests by me heretofore made & do declare this to be my last Will & Testament.
