An Inventory of the Estate of George Booth deceased August 14th 1768.

Seventeen negroes namely, Jace, Cesar, Harry, Jany, Robin, Jack, Ben, Tom, Jany, Gates, Betty, Amy, Sany, Phillis, Enaca, Patti, Hannah. eight Horse kinds, forty odd head of Cattle one hundred and forty do. Hogs, ten do Sheep, thirty three Deers and several other fowls of different kinds one Riding Chair one dozen leather Chairs, five beds and furniture thirty odd weight feathers two bed ticks and several pieces of linen of different prices three Chests two trunks one Dressing Table and one Chest of draws one blotting press, one dozen painted dishes one & half dozen do. Plates, one & half dozen do. Spoons, half dozen Silver do. two Teapots, and half dozen China Tea ware, Tea kettle, Coffee pot, two Copper kettles, one small brass ditto four Iron pots and hooks two looking glasses one and a half dozen Case knives and forks one box Hon and heaters one pair fire tongs and Shovel four Candlesticks one dozen broad hoes two dozen do. eight Axes — Some Carpenters, Coopers, and Shoemakers Tools, one spice mortar and pestle, bottles and glasses, three Stone Suggs, half dozen do mugs of different sizes, two Carts, wheels & harness for two team of Horses, two plows, and half dozen do. hoes, two frying pans half dozen pewter basins, eight delf bowls a case of Razors a hone and strap, two sets Iron wedges, half dozen water Rails & tubs, half dozen table cloaths, & half dozen towels one pair Steel pads do many scales and weights, two Iron pottrucks part of a bar of Steel about 6. one and half dozen Cyder Casks.

In the Name of God Amen I John Smith being sick and weak but of perfect sense and memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament this twenty fourth day of January 1762. Item I give and bequeath my Soul unto Almighty God that gave it. My Body to the ground to be buried at the Discretion of my Executor here after to be named

Item I give & bequeath to my Son Arthur Smith one tract or parcel of Land lying between Michael Brown's Land and my Son Arthur Smith's other Land containing sixty five Acres be the same more or less, to my said Son Arthur and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Smith the Plantation whereon he formerly lived containin one hundred and fifty Acres of Land bounded as followeth, to wit, Joining on William Brown's Land thence along a line of marked trees made to divide the said Land from my other Land

to him and his Heirs forever. I also give to my said Son William Smith one Cow and Calf.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin Smith one hundred and fifty Acres of Land adjoining the Land I have given to my Son William and divide from my other Land by a small branch to the head thence a line of mark'd trees to Baileys Land, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Joseph Smith the plantation whereon I now live containing one hundred and fifty ^{five} Acres of Land he allowing his mother the use of the Plantation during his natural life, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Smith one feather bed and furniture two new pewter dishes six new pewter plates one large pewter basin and one box Iron & pair of heaters.

Item I give to my daughter Selah Smith one feather bed and furniture two new pewter dishes six new pewter plates one large pewter basin and one box Iron and pair of heaters.

Item I constitute and appoint my Son Joseph Smith whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking all other preceding the date hereof.

Item I give and bequeath all the remaining part of my Estate that hath not been already given to be equally divided between my loving wife and my Son Joseph Smith after the death of my said wife the whole to my Son Joseph Smith.

Item my will is that my estate be not appraised.
