 of six pounds to be given up when at the age of Twenty one years by my Executors hereafter mentioned

Item I give & bequeath to my son Frederick Punnett two thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars more or less called these Mchdying and lying on the South side of the Cabbin Penworth and Amorys Penworth Down the Thompsons Quarter Swamp to the Mouth of the Long Meadows up the said meadows to John Punnett's Cove as up his land to the farther people at the beginning also one Negro Girl called Lydia gave further bond of grace to the Value of six pounds to be given up to him at the Age of Twenty one by my Executors

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Remington all the Remaining part of that Slaves Sizing on the
the west side of the Cribben branch both sides of Borden's branch to the bounding Quarter Swamp called
me hundred and fifty acres more or less also one Negro girl called Judith also one feather bed To the value
of the power.

Item Given to my son Edward Pennington the land and Plantation where as I now live all the Right and
Invent that kind of the place called Dickins to them and their heirs forever.

In my Loving Will, Elizabeth Pennington I leave the Use of my Seed and plantation Given my youngest son
to her During her Widowhood with all my stock of Cattle horses hogs & sheep with all my household goods of
all kinds also to my wife, Elizabeth I leave the care of the Remains of my Negroes, to wit, Pompey Will Henry
Peter Minnah Susannah Betsy & Elbow Emily also six parts of fifteen Arny blue Jack Frank and Peter & George
and one Copper Hill

Item I give and bequeath to my three Daughters Nehemiah Mary & Elizabeth Pinnington forty pounds each to be paid to them at the age of Eight^{teen} years by my Executors hereafter mentioned —

Now my Desire is that after my Debt being Paid and my wife Dead and that my whole & sole Estate may
be sold & the money arising from the Sale be Equally Divided between my seven Children four of
three Daughters you mentioned

I appointed my Loving Wife my son David and my Brother John Permington my heirs and sole Executors to this my Last Will and testament further more I Desire that my Estate may not be appraised therefore I Disannul all former Wills to this day Where I have had words set my hand and seal my real this 31 day of July in the year of our Lord Christ one Thousand Seven hundred Sixty Eight.
