In the name of God. Amen. I Hinchea Gilliam of Superior County being sick of body, but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God. And calling to remembrance the uncertainty of human life. Do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, First I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it me and my body to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned. And as to the rest, I give what Temporal Estate is has pleased Almighty God to bestow on me for above my debts, I dispose of as follow.

Item - I Give and bequeath to my son Hinchea Gilliam a part or parcel of Land joining William Bruggs Land, Offhand of Thompsons dead cut off from my other Lands by a line beginning at Thompsons line upon my Spring run, thence up the said run to a corner Gum on the South side of the Spring, thence about South - West to a Walnut in the old Orchard, thence a straight line to an Oak by Cooks pond, thence down a line of marsh to a line between my Home plantation and the Survey I made to Benjamin Roberts line on the side of the little Town Swamp, This cut off or South parcel of my Land cut off from the rest by the aforesaid line. I Give unto my son Hinchea Gilliam and his Heirs forever.
