In the Name of God amen I Matthew Whitfield of the Parish of Albemarle and County of Surry being very weak of body but of a sound and disposing mind & Memory Do make be god do make and or damn this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz. I understand principally & Request my soul to Almighty God - that I have it, and as for what Estate it hath pleased the Lord of his great Mercy to bestow upon me I give & dispose of as followeth.

Item I give and Devise to my son Thomas and his heirs for ever my Lands and Pleasure I purchase of John Edwards containing one hundred, seventy Acres More or less one feather Bed & 20000 one Negro Boy named James two Cows & Calves two Cows & Lambs.

Item I give and Devise to my Daughter Ann and his heirs or assigns one Negro Girl named Phillis one feather Bed and furniture two Cows & Calves two Cows & Lambs.

Item I give & Devise to my Daughter Jane & her heirs or assigns one Negro Girl named Alice one feather Bed & furniture two Cows & Calves two Cows & Lambs.

Item I give and Devise to my son William his heirs or assigns ever my College plantation whereon I now live one Negro Boy named Hobbin one feather Bed & furniture two Cows and Calves two Cows & Lambs.

Item I give and Devise to my Daughter Mary and her heirs or assigns one Negro Girl named Fortune one feather Bed and furniture two Cows and Calves two Cows & Lambs.

Item I leave the life labour and profits of my free Negroes James Jack men Frank & Cole with all the remaining part of my Estate not before disposed of to my Dear daughter Ann during her Natural life and at the Death of my living wife I give and Devise the said free Negroes James Jack Frank & Cole with all the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my five Children Thomas Mary Jane William and Mary and as soon as this my Estate may not be appraised I appoint my living wife Ann and myself Thomas to be my sole and true Executors of this my last Will and Testament I. Matthew witness of these hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this 22 day of September 1764

Item I give unto my said son William Lubbock one Negro Slave named Agatha and her issue to him
 his heirs forever

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Lubbock one feather bed & four pictures

Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Lubbock twenty five pounds

Item I give unto my grandchild John Lubbock my gold watch to be sold and after all my just debts paid

Item I give unto my Daughter William Lubbock my house with the barn and Shop

Item I give unto my said son William Lubbock two feather beds one furniture and all my other
 household stuff

Item I do hereby appoint my said son William Lubbock and William Roberts to be my true and
 sole Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set
 hand and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of January 1767
