Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Amy back and to her heirs forever, one Negro Girl named Fanny and one Negro boy named Robin, one feather bed and furniture, one pewter dish and three plates & three heads of cattle and five pounds current money and one three gallon stone Jug

Item, I give and bequeath the use of all the Remainder part of my Estate not before mentioned to my wife during her widowhood for her and her children to live on and it is my desire that after her widowhood or death it be Equally divided amongst all my children namely Mary Richard Sarah Henry Elizabeth and Anne. My Will and desire is that my Estate may at be Appraised Lastly I do nominate and appoint my Wife Anne back Executor and my son Richard Cooke Executor of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal this twenty third day of June one thousand seven hundred and sixty four.
