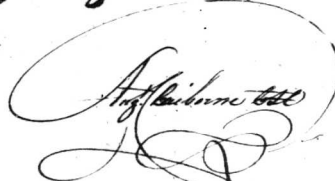

In the Name of God Amen I Sarah Sanders Being in a low State of Health but of sound mind a Memory blessed by God do make & Ordain this my last will and Testament in Manner and form (that is to say) Impressed I do give to my beloved Brother John Sanders all the money that he owes me

Item I do give to my Cousin Sarah Sanders Daughter of John Sanders four Pounds three Shillings & six pence the choice of what I have I also do give to my said Cousin Sarah --- all the rest of my Estate except the Remainder of my wearing Linnen and I do appoint my Brother John Sanders Executor of this my last will & Testament in Witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal this highworth

In the Name of God Amen I Edward Weaver of the County of Sussex and Parish of Albermarle being sick and Weak but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following

Item my will and desire is that all my Just debts and Funerall Expences be first paid by my Executors hereafter mentioned

Item my will and desire is that my beloved wife Sarah Weaver shall have the use of my Plantation whereon I now live to make use of as she thinks fit for her life or Widowhood and after her decease or Widowhood my will and desire is that the said Land be sold and Ten Pounds of money arising from the sales of the said Land to be given to my son Henry Weaver to buy him a Horse and Saddle and the residue of the money to be Equally divided between my son Henry Weaver and my Daughter Mary Weaver

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Weaver one small mare Bridle and saddle also one Feather Bed and Turniture one Pot one Pan one Bell Mettle Skillet Eleven Hogs that with by themselves two Pewter Dishes six Pewter Plates one Cow and Calf one Loom May and Harrows to her and her Heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Weaver one Feather Bed and Turniture one Cow & Calf and Thirty shillings for her Schooling to her and her Heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Henry Weaver Six Pounds Cash to buy him a Feather Bed with and Turniture one Cow and Calf also I give to my said son Four Pounds Cash to pay for his schooling to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I leave all the residue of my Estate not mentioned to be sold to discharge my Just debts And Lawfully I appoint my Loving brother Henry Weaver and Peter Roper my Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Thirtieth day of March 1772
