In the name of God Amen I Susanna Pottersbury of the County of Sussex being in a law State of Health but of sound mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me hitherto made in manner and form following that is to say.

Give to my Daughter Rachel Fanning and to her Husband one Negro Woman named Anna her feather bed of furniture one fourth part of my next Castle all my Slaves except two, One Child called Phoenix, one Child named Mary on this word give one Slave Woman and Servant pounds six Shillings eight pence Cash and of the rest I have given her share die in Estuary I give her a Horse called Blackie.

Give to Elizabeth and Susanna Pottersbury and their Heirs one Negro Woman named Lucy Lemoyne her Child one bed and furniture six hds of next Castle, Thirtysix pounds in Cash five pounds of which he leaves me one more which he has in his power One Child and her Negroe.

Give to Thomas Elizabeth Cocks and their Heirs one Negro boy named Charles one bed of furniture one large piano that one Slave to able one, fourth part of my next Castle One Slave named Lister & Servants pounds six shillings and eight pence in Cash.

Give to John Pottersbury son of my Daughter Mary and to his Heirs one Negro Woman named Jenny one bed of furniture one maz of it to be in my last Will called Diamond.

Give to my Daughter Mary Anne Dyer Son of Thomas my Slave and one Slave Child.

Give to my Grand Daugther Hannah Elizabeth St. John her bed and furniture in Cash.

Give to Nathaniel Worsley his Servants pounds six Shillings and eight pence given to him first but for my Daughter Mary Dyer in such proportion as he don't now have I shall thank the Heirs in case of this give the said Nathaniel Worsley one with his lot all the remainder of my Estate not already given in trust for my Daughter Mary to be to him during her life shall thank most convenient.

Give to my Daughters Rachel, Elizabeth & Lazarus, and my Grand Children Hannah of William Winfield all the residue and remainder of my Estate not before distributed be equalized among them share & lot.

My Will is that my Grandson John Pottersbury may live with Thomas Dyer until he shall arrive to the Age of twenty one years and that the said Dyer have the use and return of the Negro Slave given by me to the said John during the said term and I desire that the other things given by me to the said John may be sold and the money arising on the sale to be put to Interest for the use of the said John I warn that my Estate may not be defrauded.

Lastly I constitute and appoint Thomas Dyer and Elizabeth Pottersbury my true lawful Executrix of this my last Will In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand affixed my seal this 10th of November 1765.
