Thomas Clary, of Supra County being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in man-
ner and form following to wit:

I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Clary, the sole use of my Land and planta-
tion with the labour of one Negro Man named Sarah, during her life and Widowhood
likewise one feather Bed & furniture, one Iron pot, one pair of bottom boards & wheel, one
square Table, likewise half a dozen pewter plates & two cups, also six Spoon & my
Gray mare all during her life and Widowhood

I Give and bequeath to my son William Clary two Negroes Viz: Charles & Dinah to
him & his heirs forever, likewise my Gun

I Give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Clary one Negro Boy named Jack, to him
& his heirs forever, likewise my Bridle & saddle

I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas Clary one Negro Girl named Sarah, also
my Land and plantation to him & his heirs forever

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Rachel Clary, one Feather Bed & furniture

I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Clary one feather Bed and furniture

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Clary one feather Bed

I Give further my will and devise is that the Negro Man Sarah (which is left to my wife)
and all her increase should at the death or marriage of my wife be sold, and the
money arising thereby, to be equally divided amongst my three Daughters Viz: Rachel,
Lucy and Mary.

I Give I likewise devise that all the remainder of my Estate be it in what kind soever possessed
after my just debts are paid, should be equally divided amongst my six Children
at the death or marriage of their mother.

I Give further I devise there should be no appraisement on my said Estate -

I constitute and appoint my Brother Benjamin Clary of Thomas Myers to be my
sole & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament utterly revoking all other Wills
by me made. Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this
Eighteenth day of October, Anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred & sixty eight
